

Mitch had another great day with a  $2^{nd}$  in his first heat and a  $1^{st}$  in his semi. I really can't believe how good these groms looked out in the water considering the conditions.

So the final started with Mitch, Noah, Harry and Ruka in the line up. Noah was first to get a high score, with a long ride and finding reformed sections, taking that opportunity to create a number of turns. Harry was the only one to come close to that wave with turns close in the pocket. Well done to Mitch and Ruka who surfed well all day and totally deserved to be in the final. Noah sealed 1<sup>st</sup> place with a wave equal to his first. What a great win and you can see it in Noah's eyes, that he is thirsty for some more 1<sup>st</sup> places in the future.

### **B** Grade Comp 2 report

### B grade report

The second comp for 2016 was held at the right hander at the eastern end of 'the dump' beach.

This particular wave was breaking at about 1-2 foot, with the occasional 2.5 foot wash through.

We started the day with a short expression/wave familiarisation session, as most competitors had little experience at this spot.

The wind chill was high and competitors tried to warm up best they could (remember wind proof jackets next time all). The waves proved tricky, as there was a strong sweep that made staying on the take-off spot a challenge.

Once the comp started, this didn't stop several nice rides being made by some of the more experienced competitors. The ride of the day however, including a fast controlled foam climb with a razor sharp cutty high on the wall to finish, going to Tai in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Semi.

Other notable rides out the back were Lane (after the red flag; bad luck) and Max with a couple nice high lines going right and Poppy was working every last manoveour out of the waves, finishing right up on the sand.

The final looked as though it was going to go to Poppy with scores of 3 and a 6, until Tai got a second low scoring wave that bumped him in to the lead by 0.5 points. And welcome Angus to your first comp of the year and to Madeline to your first comp in MicroGroms.

I encourage B Graders to diversify their surfing by trying different locations when they are on offer. Well done to all those who got wet on the day, irrespective of waves caught. The winners were your muscles and confidence in stepping into the unknown.

### C Grade Comp 1 report

**MicroGroms C-Grade: Competition 2** 

**Sponsored by** 

AVALANCHE INDUSTRIES-QUICKSILVER, ROXY AND DC

**Date**: 17 April 2016

Surf location: Rincon, Port Noarlunga South

Weather conditions: Sunny, 22 degrees, winds 0-5 knots offshore

**Swell size**: Shoulder to head high (groms)

Number of competitors: 7

### **Competition report**

The Avalanche Industries sponsored competition 2 was held at Rincon, next to the Onkaparinga River Mouth. Seven junior surfers rocked up to the car park to see clean and glassy conditions. The waves were peeling off the reef, both left and rights were cranking.

The Rincon reef break put up some psychological challengers for some of the groms, who had never surfed over rocks in shallow water or swell this big. However, a good pep talk soon got them focusing on the wave, and the magical feeling you get from surfing glassy shoulder to head high waves.

Some of the groms couldn't resist the temptation, they were in the water charging before we (adults/pack horses) got to the beach. Oh well... better start the first heat!

The judges set the criteria to suit the perfect conditions. Surfers were asked to attempt a cutback as a major manoeuvre, perform controlled turns, surf the wave from top to bottom and ride the wave out to the shore.

Brothers Harry and Tommy capitalised on their local knowledge regarding wave selection. Consequently, they pinged off some beautiful waves. Furthermore were able to capitalise on the wave's high scoring potential with cutbacks, turns and length of ride.

### **Competition Information**

Please remember that the Club does not run Competitions based on age. They are run on individual ability and confidence. As such, Members can compete in <u>any</u> division they choose to and whilst members have the opportunity to participate in any Club Competition, no one is compelled to surf if they feel that the conditions are unsuitable.

Please make sure that your child is financial before they compete in their second comp.

A reminder to all parents or guardians, it is your responsibility for your child's safety and you must attend all contests that their child enters. If you cannot attend a particular event, at which you allow your child to compete, you must organise transport and supervision for your children and do so at your own risk.

If you are not going to be there on time, please let a committee member know so you can get your name put down on the Entry List. It is each member's responsibility to put their name down by 8:15am so that the Contest Director can have the heats drawn ASAP. If your name is not down, you may not be able to surf. Parents of young children, please help them with this process.

All members & parents are reminded not to surf in the contest area as points may be deducted at the next Comp. Competitors please leave the competition zone after their heat has finished.

Parents are asked to help with judging when their children are not involved. When your child is competing parents are reminded to stand 10m away from the judging area as we encourage all heats to be judged fairly & without any influence.
