# Comp Reports

A-Grade

Competition 2

Date: 17th March 2019

Surf location: Parsons Beach (South Coast)

Surf conditions: 10 knots-wind SE Swell size: 3 foot multiple peaks

Number of surfers: 10

Down at the beach, Head Judge Dusty reinforced the judging criteria with the 10 surfers competing. The main focus this year was to judge surfers waves to national standard.

The heat format was the same as comp 1. The top 4 ranked surfers were automatically placed in round 2 and the remaining 6 competitor surfed round 1. All surfers in round 1 progressed to round 2 to begin the knockout rounds.

Surfers in the first round found it hard to impress the judges with scores in the 0.5-3.9 range. Imi Elliot managed to buck the trend and nail a 6-point ride on a nice right hander. This one wave moved Imagen from third place to first place.

Surfers who performed radical maneuvers in the pocket with Speed and power scored high. During the knock out heat's surfers were registering scores up to 8 points per wave.

The judging standard has been set to a high level. Please feel free to discuss your heat scores with Dusty. As Dusty mentioned the idea is to beat your combined heat scores and improve on them over the year. Part of Dusty's role as head judge is to progress you surfing through education and informed feedback on your surfing, please use him.

Comp director's award went to Noah Baillie. There has been a noticeable lift in Noah's surfing at the momentlots of speed and power in his maneuvers. It is great to see him progressing as a competition surfer.

Location: Parsons Beach

Conditions: 2-3 foot beach breaks, random peaks. Light SE wind

Competitors: 18.

Parsons beach was chosen due to wind conditions and swell size. Some of the surfers had never surfed Parsons Beach before and this was a great opportunity to experience waves with more power. All surfers paddled out in their heats and caught waves. The occasional clean up set and a rip current nearby tested some of the surfer's water skills.

Before the heat draw was finalised, ten minutes was spent collecting rubbish from the pristine beach, half filling a bag with all kinds of plastic. We will continue to do this each round and promote taking a piece of rubbish from the beach every time you go surfing.

Some great surfing went down with fitness and physical strength showing through with the finalists. Ability to duck dive and negotiate shifting water currents really shone through in those surfers that made the semi-finals and finals.

Zach Palmer made the finals, surfing Parsons for the first time, pulling a fin free re-entry in his semi-final.

Ruben Williams surfed with a fractured wrist from skateboarding 2 weeks earlier and made the finals.

Chaska Glockner made the finals in his first competition for 2019 with some fast and smooth turns on both his forehand and backhand.

Cooper McEwan rode the custom board he won as most improved in 2018, winning with some smooth turns on bigger waves.

Competition Director awards went to Anastacia Peke for paddling out in 2 heats, feeling way outside her comfort zone and copping a few sets on the head. Riley Lewis was also rewarded for making it out the back for the first time in a B Grade competition.

Second comp of the year saw an increase in contestants by 2 over comp 1. Competition ran well with kids and parents all well organised with judging and comp readiness. Judging was overseen by Comp Director and close attention was paid to making sure scores were consistent across the heats. Results were close especially in the girls comp where only 1 point separated the top 3 place getters.

The standard of surfing was high with kids venturing into the green water zones. Kids displayed a lot of confidence, skill and enthusiasm. The waves were not the best with much of the outside surf flattening out quickly after contestants had taken the drop. There were still a few waves that ran well and some impressive displays of skill followed. There were a couple of turns that would have scored well in B-Grade.



# 2018 Most Improved B - Grade



Each year a surfer is recognised for their improvement across the competition calendar and in 2018 Cooper McEwan was selected. Starting the year not making it past the second round, Cooper went on to not only win heats, but come second in three finals. Leighton Clark from The Ding King sponsored the award with a custom-made surfboard as prize and presented a surprised Cooper at the end of year show at PUMPT.

Those that know Cooper will appreciate his immediate decision to order a performance twin fin surfboard based on those ridden by Mark Richards during his dominance on the world circuit from 1978-1982. Leighton Clark can shape any style of surfboard through use of his shaping machine and computer templates and finish them with quality materials and expert craftmanship.

Cooper drew up his surfboard and coloured in the spray and took it with him to discuss the finer details with Leighton. Fixed fins, custom spray, chine rails and gloss finish were going to cost extra. Cooper saved and sold to make the difference. After the first competition of 2019, Cooper collected his prize and surfed it in 1 foot waves at Southport River mouth. Every surf from then on was a good one.

Microgroms B Grade Round 2 was held at Parsons in fun 2-3 foot waves and Cooper rode his prize all the way to the final, winning his first competition in Microgroms B Grade.

Thank you to Leighton Clark and his team at The Ding King for supporting junior surfers and making quality surfboards locally. It is a wonderful part of surfing to be able to visit a shaper and order a custom surfboard. Part of our surf culture that is being lost. Get out there and support our local shapers.

# Fight for the Bight

It is hard to put into words how incredible the west coast of South Australia is. That is why it is so sad to hear of plans to drill holes in it and risk the delicate eco system. Please follow the link below and sign the petition.

Equinor has submitted an environment plan to drill for fossil fuels in the Great Australian Bight.

They released a plan open to Public comment - they had 18 months to prepare this, and they are only giving the public 30 DAYS to comment on it and make any opposition known.

We need to stop this!

The Great Australian Bight is a vital home and breeding ground for southern right whales, endangered pygmy blue whales and southern blue-fin tuna. It's an essential feeding ground for endangered sea lions, great white sharks, migratory sperm whales and many other species of marine animals. It shelters Leafy Sea Dragons, seals, many species of sharks and dolphins. Around 85 % of all the marine species that are found in the Bight occur nowhere else on the planet, and they need the delicate balance of this specific ecosystem to survive.

Please sign this petition, and make your comments in opposition to this plan known!

This is an ecological disaster waiting to happen. They let one company start to drill.. where will it end?

Drilling for oil, seismic testing and removal of fossil fuel from this fragile Eco system is pure greed.

Destroying this natural wonder, killing it's marine life and contributing to global warming for a handful of greedy humans to make more money is pointless insanity, as soon, none of us will have a planet earth to call home.
